**A Multifaith, Multiracial Community Organization Can Power Systemic Change in Annapolis & Anne Arundel County**

For the past year, clergy and lay leaders from 14 diverse faith communities (and growing) in Annapolis and Anne Arundel County have been meeting monthly to determine how we can build power together to solve systemic problems in our communities. The group is using the faith-based community organizing model from the [Industrial Areas Foundation](#) (IAF) which was founded by the 1967 [UUA Ware Speaker](#), Saul Alinsky. The IAF model includes growing leaders in our communities; developing relationships based on our shared vision for change; and building community in power so we can act collectively to create long term, systemic solutions.

Over 15 people have gone to IAF leadership training (including UUCA members Sarah Davis and me). We also have attended some actions run by other local IAF faith community organizations: [WIN in Washington DC](#); [AIM in Montgomery County](#); and [BUILD in Baltimore](#). These experienced IAF organizations have won: the first living wage campaign in the U.S.; \$1B for school construction in Baltimore; \$600M for affordable housing in Montgomery County and the DREAM act in Maryland

Rev. Fred's long time encouragement and hope that local faith communities would join together in solidarity for social justice is now becoming a reality. Members of UUCA have also noted some possible benefits for our congregation:

- ~The IAF relational model can bring UUCA members together as we go through our ministerial transition over the next few years
- ~The IAF framework is proven and effective by over 60 faith-based organizations country-wide and could be used as a model for our own social justice ministry
- ~UUCA can be a founding member of a community organization focused on solving social justice issues that is multifaith, multiracial and non-partisan

Please join us next month and learn more about this movement; how the relational model works; and how to get involved. ### Board of Trustees Takes Action In Three Important Areas

The Board has taken three important actions recently that we want to share with the congregation: Board action on Rev. Fred's "Minister Emeritus" status and actions in the interim minister search process and on creating a Board Finance Committee.

The Board voted in its July meeting to recommend that Rev. Fred be honored with emeritus status given his wonderful service to UUCA and to Unitarian Universalism. According to UUA policies, the title "Minister Emeritus" is granted to honor long and meritorious service to a congregation where the minister has given devoted and exceptional ministerial leadership. The procedure requires a vote of the congregation to confer Minister Emeritus status upon a minister. This process begins with a recommendation by the congregation's Board of Trustees. The Board has made this recommendation and placed this issue on the agenda of the upcoming Congregational Meeting scheduled for Sunday, December 3.

After much study and deliberation, the Interim Minister Search Committee concluded that the projected 18-month term for our interim was far too short to accomplish all that needs to be done during this time of transition. The Board approved their recommendation to seek a 30-month interim. On our Application for Interim Minister we identified important strengths and programs of our congregation including social activism, spirit of volunteerism, encouragement of theological diversity and religious exploration and music programs. The Application also asks us to list characteristics we need in an Interim Minister. Among those identified are: managerial skills, receptivity to new technological strategies, financial practicality and expertise with governance models.

Lastly, the Board voted to establish the Finance Committee as a permanent Board Committee to make recommendations to the Board and ultimately to the congregation on next year's UUCA budget. The Committee is chaired by Maury Marks. Other members include Jackie Heimbuch, Eric Petterson, Dan Moreau and Ken Apfel.



The next Board Meeting is scheduled for Monday, **September 11**, at 6:45 PM.



## Why Do We Sing?

In July, I had the privilege of serving on the worship design team for the UU Musicians Network's national conference in Arlington. Beginning in March, our team of five began to brainstorm around the conference's theme "Beyond the Wall: Expanding the View of Music Ministry in Your Community." The culmination of our efforts resulted in a series of five thematic services infused with music, art, and dance. A highlight of the conference was leading an enthusiastic group of 250 musicians in song!

As I think about expanding the view of music ministry at UUCA, I'm happy to have realized two new initiatives: a hospice choir, and a M.A.D. (Music, Art & Drama) Camp for young people entering third-eighth grade.

At UUCA we are blessed with a music ministry whose passion for music helps to lead and inspire our weekly worship, and there's always room for more! While participants may join at any time, September is the perfect time. So, why do our "veteran" singers participate? Here's what several had to say:



*Certainly not because I am a solo-quality singer. Mine is a blendy-voice. Simply, because making music with others is the most self-rewarding blessing. It is hard work. No leftover brain space for the worries of the day.*

*We are the original UUCA affinity group. We care about each other and celebrate life's ups and downs together. Our eclectic repertoire reminds us of global truths and celebrates our faith's respect-worthy diversity.*

*I sing because it brings me joy. It fulfills my spiritual needs because I have always been moved by sounds rather than words.*

*I joined the UUCA choir after my child had grown enough for me to begin to return to the things that make me, ME. I missed the magic that happens when a gathering of voices combine to make something larger, something that is mysterious and lovely. Singing in the choir is also what I have to give to my church community.*

*Singing beautiful music, with meaningful texts, in harmony with others can be a profound experience. Sometimes joyous, sometimes sad, often thought-provoking, it is for me the closest thing to a spiritual experience I can imagine.*

*For me, the two-hours of rehearsal each week are like an oasis in an otherwise hectic week. For two hours I think about nothing but contributing beautiful sounds to the group, and I love the satisfaction and teamwork of coming together to learn a challenging song.*

*Singing together is fun, healthy, and keeps the brain working. Plus, we party twice a year!*


